Midwest Energy Awards Eighteen Youth Scholarships Two Students Selected for Youth Tour Trip to Washington, D.C.

As a customer-owned electric and natural gas cooperative, Midwest Energy operates according to the Seven Cooperative Principles. These guiding values shape how we serve our members and communities. One of these principles, Concern for Community, reflects our ongoing commitment to investing in the people and places we call home.

Midwest Energy demonstrates this commitment through a variety of programs, including our Youth Scholarship and Youth Tour initiatives. These programs are designed to support and inspire the next generation of leaders by recognizing academic achievement and providing unique educational experiences.

Each year, Midwest Energy's Board of Directors carefully reviews applications and selects 18 outstanding high school seniors to receive \$1,000 scholarships.

Additionally, two high school juniors are chosen to represent Midwest Energy on an all-expenses-paid, week-long trip to Washington, D.C. as part of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association's Youth Tour.

Spring Community Fund Recipients Announced

Midwest Energy's Community Fund, which benefits charitable, educational and nonprofit agencies in the co-op's service area, made one of its two annual disbursements in April.

A total of \$54,078 was awarded to 100 projects. A total of 123 applications requesting \$104,951 were received. Among applications, 22 were first-time program applicants.

Nominees must be a resident in one of the counties in the district for which he or she is nominated and receive retail electric or natural gas

service from Midwest Energy.
